

# 1 REGISTER TO VOTE

Every vote begins with making sure you're registered and your information is up to date.

Register to vote, verify your registration, check deadlines, find your polling place, and view your ballot.

Find your official state election office, voter registration information, and election resources.

# 2 MAKE YOUR VOTING PLAN

- Confirm you're registered.
- Decide whether you'll vote early, by mail, or on Election Day.
- Find your polling place (if voting in person).
- Preview your ballot and learn about candidates and ballot measures.
- Know what ID or documents your state requires.
- Tell a friend or family member your plan—and encourage them to make one too.

**Vote.org**  
Register to vote, check your registration, learn about early voting and vote-by-mail options, and receive election reminders.

# 3 HELP SOMEONE VOTE

- Offer someone a ride to the polls.
- Help someone check their registration.
- Help someone find their polling place.
- Encourage friends and family to make a voting plan.
- Ask at least five friends or family members to check their voter registration.
- Share reliable, nonpartisan voting information.

# 4 VOLUNTEER

- Serve as a poll worker or election volunteer.
- Help register eligible voters.
- Volunteer with a nonpartisan voter education organization.
- Assist with voter outreach (phone calls, texts, or letters).
- Support community events that encourage civic participation.
- Help provide transportation or other assistance to voters who need it.
